

## The Jack Work Memorial Trophy – coordinator Jim Little

Jack Work is considered by many to have been a pioneer in the hobby of railway modelling. During the 1950's and 60's he shared much of his substantial knowledge and accomplishments with the modelling public through many articles in noted periodicals. After his death in June 1996, his stainless-steel railway whistle was kindly donated to the 7th Division and now is the basis of the Jack Work Memorial Trophy.

The trophy is presented annually to the 7th Division member who best exhibits the qualities that Jack Work displayed, namely: imagination, creativity, innovation, artistry, forward thinking, quality workmanship and the sharing of the results of these qualities with the rest of the hobby. The award may only be received once in a lifetime. The candidates are nominated by their peers.

The trophy honours modelling accomplishments and the sharing of those accomplishments and their appropriate model-building techniques and methods. It was first awarded in 1998.

## The Ross Heriot Gold Spike Award – coordinator John Green

The award is presented annually to the individual or individuals in the 7th Division who has made a significant contribution to the division. It is in appreciation of his/her unselfish devotion of time and effort to further the aims of the NMRA, the PNR and the hobby of railway modelling through assistance and service for the benefit of all railway modellers within the division.

The award is a once-in-a-lifetime presentation and candidates are nominated by their peers.

The award is a simulated gold spike on a plaque, and it was initially presented back in 1968. The spike is a real E&N railway spike.

## Railway Heritage Award – interim coordinator John Martin

This award was established in 2018 and will be presented for the first time at RMMBC in May 2020. It recognizes outstanding contributions to the preservation of railway history.

To be considered for the award, the nominee shall have performed service in one or more of the following ways:

- Have been a member of an historical association or society that works on the preservation and presentation of railway history and artifacts; or
- Have contributed to the preservation of railway history through published writings, or by having volunteered to work on restoration projects, or sat on boards of historical societies or museums that

- contributed to the preservation of railway history; or
- Have exhibited a substantial interest in the history of railways in British Columbia and its preservation; or
- Put in many hours volunteering with an operating historical railway as a member of the operating crew or as a docent traveling with the train telling the general public about railway history; or
- Have contributed in some other significant and worthy efforts to preserve railway heritage.

## Nanaimo Model Railroad Show

The 36th annual Nanaimo Model Railroad Show is coming up on Sunday April 26th. As in recent years, the show will be held in the Beban Park Recreation Centre, 2300 Bowen Road, Nanaimo, with lots of free parking available. Although the show started out as a small meet for Vancouver Island modellers, it has grown to attract over 1,250 visitors, mostly members of the general public.

At time of writing, this year's show promises:

- twelve layouts or modules ranging in size from micro-layouts to the newly expanded North Island Model Railroaders Club layout, with Z, N, HO, OO, O, 1 and G scales, plus a display of 7.25" gauge Live Steam
- over 70 tables reserved with at least eight major vendors and numerous small vendors and manufacturers
- tables by several local societies and museums including the 7th Division
- scenery modelling presentations by Tom Beaton and Phil Holden

Up until last year, the show was organised by a team led by Ken Rutherford and Rick Lord. This year Chris Sundstrom has his hand on the throttle with a new team behind him.

If you live on Vancouver Island, or will be visiting the island on April 26th, take the opportunity to see this show. You will be glad you did.

## Vancouver Train Expo 2020 Update

Vancouver Train Expo 2019 was successful on all fronts as I reported in the January/February 2020 Bulletin Board. A few things remain to be done, most notably filing Income Tax and GST returns.

The Lower Mainland Train Expo Society held its Annual General Meeting on 26 January 2020 with all members present. With most of the administrative actions addressed, and the commitment of committee members to work on Vancouver Train Expo 2020, planning can begin.

The first steps will be securing the venue and insurance. We currently have a "first hold" on the weekend following Remembrance Day (November 13 - 15) and an expressed interest in the weekend before, however, there are others with prior "holds" on that date. Obtaining affordable bodily injury and property (liability) insurance that complies with the PNE's contract is a precondition to securing the venue. Actions are underway on both of these issues, and will lead to the establishment of a budget. Assuming success, planning will progress with registration forms for exhibitors and vendors to be posted on the website (<a href="https://www.vancouvertrainexpo.ca">www.vancouvertrainexpo.ca</a>) early in May.

Renewing the Organizing Committee with capable people willing to do, and to take responsibility for, the almost year round business of organizing the event remains a challenge. While knowledge of model railroading is an asset, business, promotion, marketing, logistics, creative and human/public relations skills are more important. #### **Clinics**

In addition to the keynote presentation noted above, Trevor Marshall will also be presenting an additional clinic as part of the excellent clinic stream planned for RMMBC. The 2020 clinics will include such wide ranging topics as building scenery, electronics, buildings, rolling stock, and more. We'll also have returning favourites like operating sessions (with new layouts operating), layout tours (this year touring layouts on the North Shore), display room, and Meet the Modeller among others.
