Yes – you can join in without video if you don't have a computer camera or don't feel comfortable showing everyone how messy your train room has become during covid-19.

If you're going to join the AGM by telephone, dial one of the "Canada" numbers on Nov 12th at 6:55pm and follow the instructions. It's very easy. (The necessary meeting number and password are shown below and will be sent again in November.)

Virtual RMMBC a Success!

Back in February the Railway Modellers Meet of BC (RMMBC) Committee was working through the normal organisational work preparing for the meet in May. There was no mention of COVID-19 at the February 3rd organisational meeting.

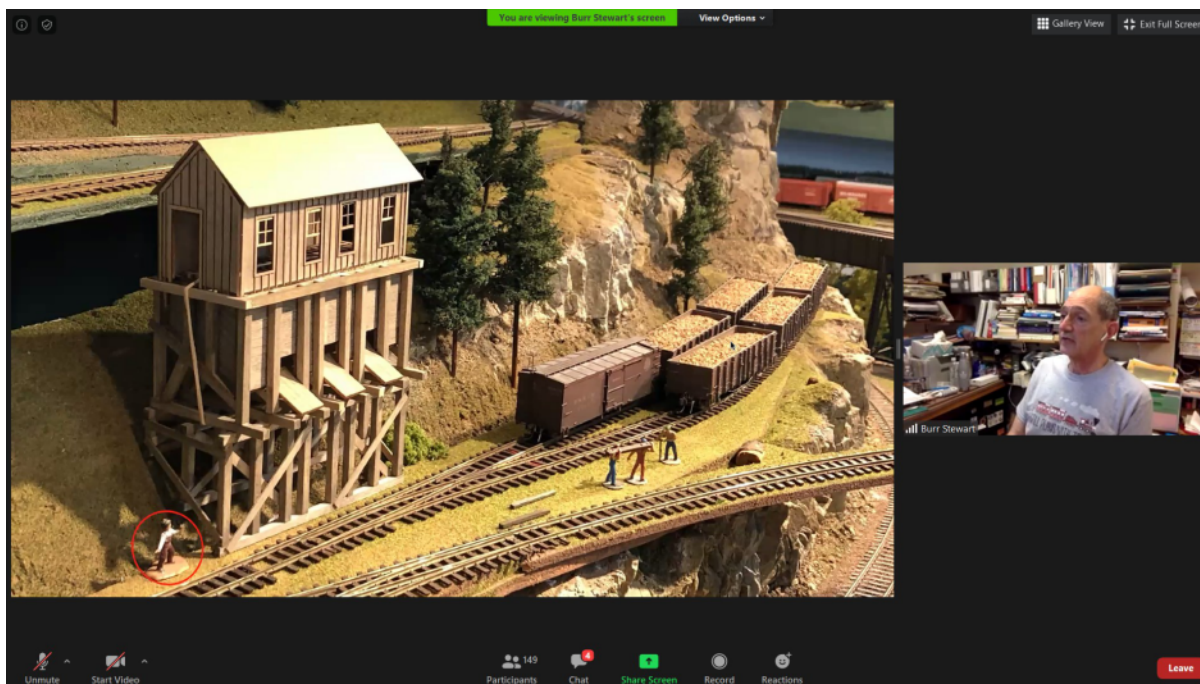
By the end of March the world had changed and the RMMBC Committee realized they had a serious problem. The COVID-19 pandemic was gathering steam and SFU was starting to talk about not allowing the meet to use their facilities. It was becoming very clear that a face-to-face meet would not be possible.

The solution they came up with, after a good deal of discussion and testing possible solutions, was a virtual RMMBC provided using ZOOM and providing a set of six clinics and a Meet the Modeller session over four days. The goal was to try to come as close to an in-person meet as possible, with live clinics, attendee registration (no charge), an appropriate degree of attendee interaction with the clinic presenters, and a Meet the Modeller session based loosely on the popular Meet the Modeller event at the in-person RMMBC. This approach differs from the majority of similar virtual events being put on in the hobby.

Clinic presenters chosen from those lined up for the RMMBC were approached and, once they agreed to participate in the virtual meet, were briefed on what they had to be aware of in a live on-line presentation. The meet publicity had to be totally redone (publicity for a face-to-face meet was still being sent out at the beginning of March, for example). Moderators were trained to run the ZOOM sessions and deal with possible security issues (none reared its head, as it happened). Practice sessions were run. A new registration system was set up. Many small but essential points were dealt with.

By Thursday May 21st the meet was ready to go live. The first two clinicians, Trevor Marshall and Bill Decker, were standing by, with a third presenter ready to jump in if needed. Over 380 people had registered to attend and a good proportion of them connected in for the first two clinics.

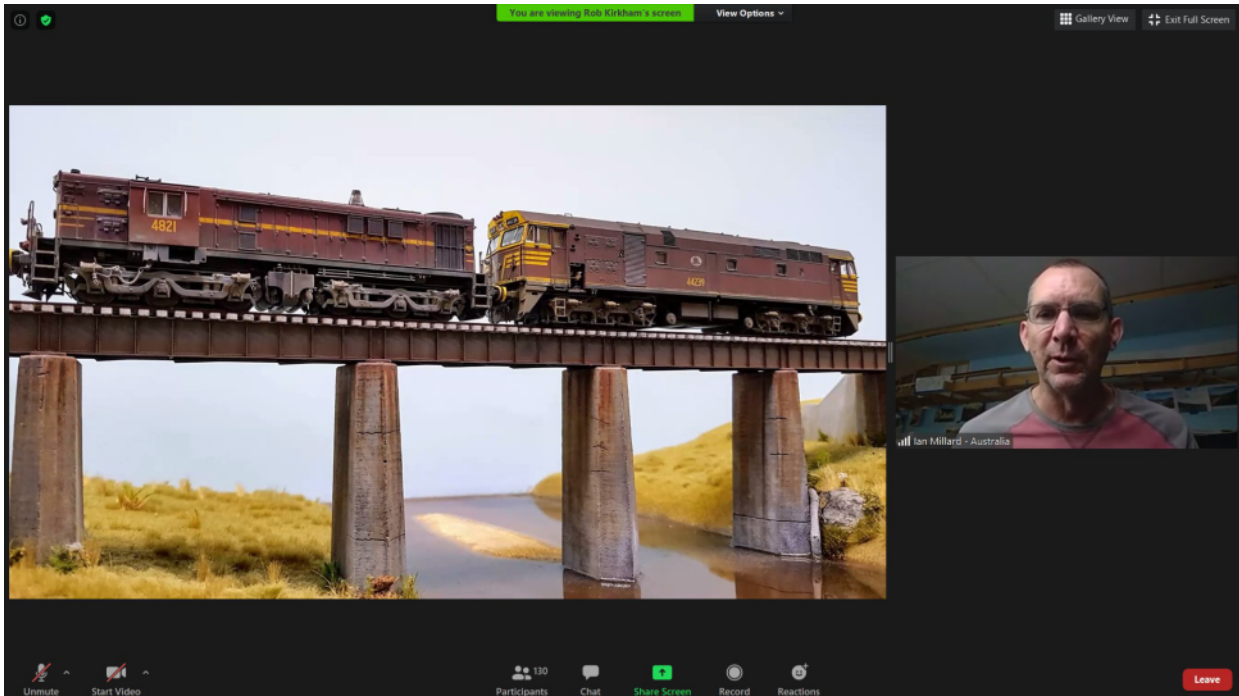
The evening went very well. A post event committee meeting identified a few things that could be done better next time, but they were quite minor.

On May 28th two additional clinicians, Burr Steward and Mark Dance, presented their clinics to a slightly bigger audience. This also went very well.

The third Thursday, June 2nd, was the Meet the Modeller night. This was something quite different from the clinic presentations and also very different from what other virtual meets were attempting. Meet attendees were asked to provide some photos of model projects they had worked on and to be prepared to be briefly interviewed by a host (Rob Kirkham) about their project, what interested them about it, and how they went about it. Over twenty modellers volunteered and participated. This went very well, with no significant hiccups and a lot of interesting information shared.

The fourth and final Thursday, June 9th, had two more clinicians, Matt Robson and Peter Steinmetz. These clinics were slightly different from the earlier ones, with one focussed on prototype information (the Southern Railway of BC) and the other on demonstrating a weathering technique. Both clinics were enthusiastically received. The total meet registration by the last day was just over 550 participants.

Contacted at the end of August and asked for his comments, Rene Gourley, the RMMBC Committee Chair, said that the people involved in putting on the meet can be justly proud of putting on a very high quality event with few issues. It was, he stated, a "fantastic success".

At the moment we don't know if we will be able to put on a face-to-face RMMBC next year or if we will need to do another virtual event. In either case we have shown that we can successfully do either.



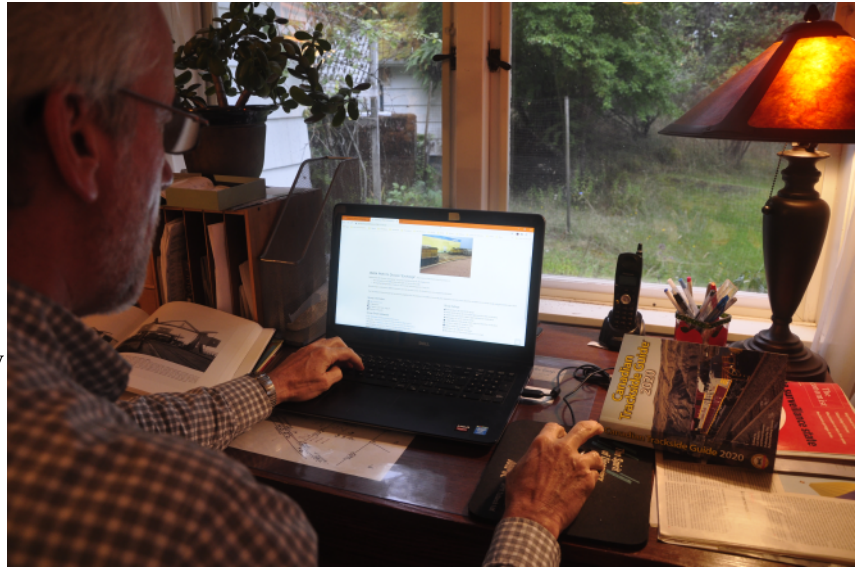
The Exchange – The 7th Division's New Online Meeting Place

Our objective is to learn more about the modellers in our local areas and get to know each other.



The site is open right now and ready for you to sign-up (see below). Join today, then come back on Grand Opening Day (September 15th) to buy or sell and to see what’s new.

7th Division PNR Exchange

This is a group maintained by the 7th Division for:

- (1) the exchange of modelling ideas amongst our local community; and
- (2) the buying/selling/trading of new or used model railroading gear of any sort.

Membership is restricted to NMRA members and everyone in the 7th Division is encouraged to participate. We would like you to use your real name and location (city) in your posts for the benefit of other modellers in your local area. That will allow us to get to know each other better. We have no problem with John Green listing himself as “GreenJohn” but names like “Mad Modeller” or “HO Hobbit” are discouraged.

This is NOT a public group. Membership is restricted and it is only for our own community of like-minded modellers.

Joining

To join the group use one of the following methods:

- Send an email to: 7thDivision-PNR-Exchange+subscribe@groups.io
- with the subject “I would Like to join.”

OR

- Visit <https://groups.io> or www.groups.io
- Sign Up or Log In (upper right corner)
- Click “Find or create a group” – (top left)
- Type “7th Division” in the search box (upper right) and press ENTER
- Click On 7thDivision-PNR-Exchange – this will take you to the group’s home page
- Click the “Apply For Membership” button

After you have asked to join the group, the following things will happen:

- If you are not already a Groups.io member, you will receive an e-mail from Groups.io thanking you for your interest. At the end of that email is a confirmation “button” which you must “click” to accept Groups.io terms of service and confirm your e-mail address. You will then be taken to Groups.io’s login site where you will be asked to create a password and be able to access your Groups.io profile.
- You will receive another email from 7th Division-PNR-Exchange@groups.io requesting your Name, Location and NMRA Member Number.
- After you reply to the email (with the requested information), your application will be reviewed, and you will be accepted into the group.
- Provided you have confirmed your Groups.io account as noted above, you may read other postings right away. You can post yourself as soon as you are accepted into the group.
- If you did not setup a Groups.io Display Name in the “Identity” section (4th button down, left hand side) of the Groups.io profile page during the confirmation process above, expect this message from 7thDivision-PNR-Exchange@groups.io: “We have noticed that your Groups.io Display Name has not been set. When you get a chance please set it.”
- Acceptance is usually within 24 hours.

Posting

It’s easy. Click on New Topic and fire away. To share your current project, the subject line of your modelling posts should include: MODEL. Then, add whatever photos and text you’d like to share.

Gear Exchange

This is the place to find new homes for items that you are no longer using and to look for used model railroading items of any sort in our local community. The assumption is that most transactions will be concluded in person and will not require shipping, but this can be arranged by the seller and buyer.

The idea is no fees and simplicity. Think of it as an online swap-meet. Whether it is new in the box or just collecting dust, you may have what others are looking for.

We welcome all who are looking to buy, sell, or trade:

- locomotives, rolling stock, and accessories of any type, e.g. DCC gear
- finished or unfinished models/kits
- hard-to-find items
- train-related videos, books, printed material, and other media
- spare parts and junkers

We also welcome Retailers and Manufacturers offering deep-discounts, close-outs, or rare items.

Please follow these guidelines to post:

Your Subject Line should include a code:

FS: For Sale

WTB: Want To Buy

WTT or TR: Want To Trade

And include the scale of items: TT, N, HO, S, G, MISC (for items without a scale)

For example: FS HO or WTB TT or FS Misc

Provide your asking price in Canadian dollars - C\$.

Attach a photo of your item(s) or place one in the Photos Section with a link to your post.

Post all replies to questions on the message board.

Conduct your business by private email.

Provide your location (city) in all such posts – so interested buyers can know if you are in their local area.

When an item sells, please DELETE ALL photos and POST a SOLD message under your original thread.

Do not post “or best offer” sales as that can lead to an auction-like bidding competition. The ethics of our group is that sales are to be conducted on a first-come, first-served basis.
