# Vancouver Train Expo 2024 Update

My update in the January/February edition of the Bulletin Board provided a summary of Vancouver Train Expo 2023. As you will recall, I reported that low attendance had impacted the financial outcome. It turns out the 2023 event lost \$1,412 *after* paying exhibitor travel expenses and honoraria. The British Columbia Society of Model Engineers graciously donated \$1,500 from the proceeds of the mini rail train rides to offset the loss. As a result we start 2024 with the same amount of working capital. This is, with the addition of pre-event booth and table rentals, sufficient to fund approximately 85 percent of the event's upfront costs.

Planning for Vancouver Train Expo 2024 at the PNE Forum, November 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> (load in on the 1<sup>st</sup>) has started. An initial canvas of suppliers suggests that we do not face significant price increases.

The next step is to canvas exhibitors and vendors. In my previous update I mentioned that the number of small exhibits had shrunk and the demand for booth space declined. We could have accommodated an additional good sized layout exhibit and had underutilized booth space. Hence, the response to this initial canvas of exhibitors and vendors will be a key determinant in the deciding the viability of this year's event.

The Organizing Committee remains intact, although the demands of everyday life are impacting the time some members have available to devote to the event. This lost capacity will need to be replaced somehow. In particular, back up volunteers are needed for each of committee positions and additional promotional capacity is required. The plan is to collect the information needed to make a decision on Vancouver Train Expo 2024 sometime in May. While this may seem early, the timing is driven by the need to secure the venue, which in turn triggers the payment of non-refundable deposits.

We are pleased to report that over 170 "full-fare" NMRA members have registered to attend, as well as 32 "non-rail" guests who participate in a program for those who have decided to accompany their significant other but have yet to fall in love with model trains. We even have four youth registrants – hopefully they are future 7<sup>th</sup> Division members.
